A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TOWN DISCOVERY BAY COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT RE-AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE TOWN OF DISCOVERY BAY COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, the Town of Discovery Bay Community Services District (the "Town") is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the Town's legislative body are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative body conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provision for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Board of Directors previously adopted a Resolution, Number 2021-16 on October 20, 2021, finding that the requisite conditions exist for the legislative body of the Town to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of extending the use of the provisions found in section 54953(e), the Board of Directors must make findings that the Board has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency that exist in the Town, and that either the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor proclaimed a State of Emergency continues to exist throughout California as a result of the threat of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, currently the dominant strain of COVID-19 in the country continues to be more transmissible than prior variants of the virus, may cause more severe illness, and that even fully vaccinated individuals can spread the virus to others resulting in rapid and alarming rates of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, therefore, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees and members; and

WHEREAS, the Cal-OSHA adopted emergency regulations (Section 3205) imposing requirements on California employers, including measures to promote social distancing remain in effect; and

WHEREAS, the Contra Costa County Health Officer, through guidance and current health orders, strongly encourages indoor masking for everyone, regardless of vaccination status, recommends measures for social distancing when individuals have been exposed to COVID-19, and also acknowledges that close contact to other persons increases risk of transmission.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TOWN OF DISCOVERY BAY COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>AB 361 Compliance</u>. The Board of Directors began using teleconferencing in accordance with subdivision (e) of Section 54953 of the Government Code, as amended by AB 361, on October 20, 2021, and have made the requisite findings by majority vote not later than 30 days after October 20, 2021, and every 30 days thereafter.

Section 3. <u>State of Emergency</u>. The Board of Directors hereby reconsiders the circumstances of the current State of Emergency proclaimed by the Governor on March 4, 2020, and find that the ongoing conditions of the State of Emergency directly impact the ability of members to meet safely in person.

Section 4. <u>Measures to Promote Social Distancing</u>. The Board of Directors hereby finds that Cal-OSHA and the County Health Official continue to recommend measures to promote physical distancing.

Section 5. Remote Teleconference Meetings. The General Manager of the Town of Discovery Bay Community Services District is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 6. Effective Date of Resolution. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.









Total Monthly Flow




WWTP 2

Agenda Title

Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Approval to Place a Holiday Tree at the Community Center.

Recommended Action

Approve that a community-owned Holiday Tree be allowed on the south front lawn area of the Community Center subject to conditions of staff approval.

Executive Summary:

Vandals cut down the Holiday Tree formerly located at the Hoffman Shopping Center. Since then, community leaders in Discovery Bay have taken it upon themselves to come together and purchase a twenty-foot artificial holiday tree so that Discovery Bay could continue the tradition of a community holiday tree lighting event.

In 2021, the tree was set up at the Hoffman Shopping Center. This year, it was requested that the tree be placed at the Community Center. Staff met with community members Rita Caruso and Lisa Combs to discuss the best placement of the Holiday Tree at the Community Center. Staff reviewed locations to place the tree and settled on the south front grass area of the Community Center property (see attached picture for the site). Upon board approval, staff will require that the community group provide insurance and indemnify the Town of any liability.

Tree Description:

- artificial tree
- tree height is 20 feet tall plus 3ft star tree topper and decorations
- weight 915 pounds

Installation & Tear Down:

- Casey Banks will install the tree
- proposed installation date, the weekend of November 26, 2022;
- proposed tear-down date, the weekend of January 7, 2023.

Discussion and Possible Action to Approve Funding for the Community Center Grounds Improvement Project.

Recommended Action

Approve expenditures for the Community Center Grounds Improvement Project ("CCGIP") in the amount of \$128,400.00, with a not to exceed amount of \$78,400 to come from the Hoffman settlement fund; and authorize the General Manager to execute any and all contracts and purchases associated therewith.

Executive Summary

The Community Center acts as the hub of our community and has recently gone through several much-needed improvements with the very popular swimming pool, dog park, tennis and pickleball courts and most recent golf cart parking. The Board of Directors have decided to periodically conduct outdoor board meetings to showcase our upgraded Community Center amenities. The location and backdrop of the outdoor board meetings will be on the grounds located behind the N/E corner of the Community Center. Currently, this area is a nonfunctional unimproved eye-sore of wasted space that detracts from the other upgraded amenities at the Community Center.

Staff's recommendation is to not only make this location functional and suitable for outdoor Board Meetings, but to also rehabilitate the space into a drought tolerant area that can be enjoyed by adults and children year-round.

The first portion of the CCGIP will be taking the north side of the proposed area and turning it into a shaded area for parents and children to hang out and enjoy the creativity of music. Music ignites all areas of child development and skills, including intellectual, social-emotional, motor, language, and literacy. It has been found that music helps facilitate learning other subjects and enhances skills that children inevitably use in other areas.

The second portion of the CCGIP will be taking the larger area abutting the N/E corner of the Community Center and turning it into a multi-use area for all to enjoy. Not only will this area allow for additional seating and shade for people to congregate, relax and be social, but it will also serve as the perfect location for outdoor board meetings, Movies in the Park, and other special events

Estimated Expenses

Project Cost: \$107,000.00 20% Contingency: \$21,400.00 Not to Exceed Total: \$128,400.00

Funding sources: \$20,000 from Community Center donations, \$30,000 from Water/Wastewater, and \$78,400.00 from the Hoffman settlement.


Staff presented this improvement project idea to the Parks and Recreation Committee on September 7th and is now bringing it before the board for consideration.

Approve the extension of the DBRS priority use of the Community Center pickleball Courts Resolution 2022-33, under the same terms, priorities, and use conditions contained in Resolution 2020-24, to December 31, 2024.

Executive Summary

In 2020, the District used a combination of grant funds and a Discovery Bay Recreation and Sports, Inc ("DBRS") donation of \$30,000 to covert two Community Center tennis courts into pickleball courts. As an acknowledgement of the DBRS monetary donation, the Board passed Resolution 2020-24 allowing limited priority use of the pickleball courts to DBRS. Resolution 2020-24 is set to expire December 31, 2022.

Staff recommends extending by Resolution the same limited terms, priorities, and use conditions of Resolution 2020-24 to December 31, 2024. Staff is open to discussion with DBRS regarding modifying the days and times of priority use contained in Section 2 of Resolution 2020-24. Staff recommends, in the best interest of the District, the general public, and revenue generation, that all other provisions in Resolution 2020-24 remain the same.

WHEREAS, the Town conducted a study of the costs required to convert the Community Center tennis courts into pickleball courts and determined that the costs exceeded grant funding awarded to the Town for recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, DBRS provided a monetary donation of up to \$30,000 to the Town for the purpose of covering the funding gap for the project to convert tennis courts at the Town's Community Center to pickleball courts (the "Pickleball Courts"); and

WHEREAS, the Pickleball Courts are a vital community resource that are used to foster community involvement and development; and

WHEREAS, to acknowledge the monetary donation by DBRS for the Pickleball Courts, the Town's Board of Directors (the "Board") desires to prioritize use of the Pickleball Courts by DBRS for purposes specified in this Resolution, to the extent that such use does not interfere with Town activities or other Town-related uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TOWN OF DISCOVERY BAY COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Priorities for Use of Pickleball Courts

Use of the Pickleball Courts will be in accordance with the following priorities, listed from first to last:

- 1. Town-related or sponsored programs and/or activities
- 2. Paid rentals
- 3. General Public
- 4. Discovery Bay Recreation & Sports, Inc. ("DBRS")

SECTION 2. DBRS Use of Pickleball Courts #3-6

Provided there are no conflicting (i) Town-related or sponsored programs and/or activities, or (ii) paid rentals, DBRS will have the right to use the Pickleball Courts #3, 4, 5, 6 according to the following schedule:

- 1. Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays between the hours of 8am through 12pm
- 2. Wednesdays from 4pm (3pm during standard time) until close
- 3. Mondays and Fridays from 4pm (3pm during standard time) until close

SECTION 3. DBRS Tournament Use

DBRS will submit a Special Event Permit Application to the Town for use of the Pickleball Courts to conduct a pickleball tournament at least 60 calendar days before the first day of the tournament.

Provided there are no conflicting (i) Town-related or sponsored programs and/or activities, or (ii) paid rentals, the Town will waive rental charges otherwise applicable to DBRS for its use of the Pickleball Courts to conduct two pickleball tournaments per calendar year.

SECTION 4. Conditions of Use

Any use of the Pickleball Courts by DBRS will be subject to all terms, conditions, rules, regulations, and policies for the use of the Town's facilities, as currently approved and as amended or added by the Town from time to time.

The Town reserves the right to cancel, revoke, or suspend any and all use of the Pickleball Courts by DBRS, with or without cause.

SECTION 5. This Resolution will take effect immediately and remain in effect until December 31, 2022, unless the Town's Board of Directors take action directing otherwise.
