

Dog Park Maintenance and Improvement Plan

Background

The Town of Discovery Bay C.S.D. opened its first official Dog Park in a one-acre area located at the very back of the property behind the Discovery Bay Community Center in June, 2015. This park provides dogs and their owners a place to socialize, play and get out to stretch those legs! Funding for this park came through a variety of group and individual sponsors, as well as through the private purchase of Dedication/Memorial plates currently displayed on the park premises. Additionally, not long afterwards, the Town fenced off part of the park area specifically for small dogs, with the larger front section remaining for the enjoyment of large dogs.

As funding for improvements and general maintenance are very limited, the Town has partnered with the Discovery Bay Lions Club for the purpose of raising funds for both improvements and general maintenance through a new event entitled "Paws on Parade". An inaugural event was held the last Saturday in April and raised just over \$4,000 that will be split 50/50 between general maintenance and improvements.

Therefore, the purpose of this brief report will be to outline the various general maintenance and improvements priorities for the current Town fiscal year as outlined by staff, along with any long-term priorities that may exceed current years funding.
