

The tools and skills learned from this program will allow the children of our community the opportunity to make realistic choices concerning overall safety in the world we live in today. Through participation, parents of the children involved in the program will also understand those choices.

The goals of this program are to empower our children to make wise and safe decisions when confronted with potentially dangerous situations that they may encounter in their daily routine. A few of the topics covered are Home Safety, School Safety, Out and About Safety, Good and Bad Strangers, and what to do in emergency situations. The skills learned in this program will benefit our children as they grow up in today's ever changing world.

RadKIDS believes that effective safety education is greatly enhanced when parents take an active role in the educational process. RadKIDS classes are designed to encourage parent interaction throughout the course. The radKIDS parent manual outlines all information and topics presented to children in radKIDS to provide parents the opportunity for additional conversation outside the classroom environment. We are offering our first radKIDS summer camp for kids between the ages of 5-7 years old. The class will be held June 19-23 from 0900-1100 at the Discovery Bay Community Center. There will be a mandatory parents meeting held on June 12th at 630p.m. and June 13th at 6 p.m. This summer camp will be offered at no cost to families. The class will be limited to 25 children.

Theft Related Crimes

Auto Burglary #17-4376

On 04/06/2017 on the 1000 block of willow lake Rd., the Sheriff's Department responded to a report of a auto burglary. Some time between Wednesday at 1900 through Thursday 0400 the home owners vehicle was rummaged through and a GPS and various tools were taken from their vehicle. Their were no signs of forced entry to the vehicle. Approximate value of missing items is approximately \$1,795.00.

Auto Burglary #17-4373

On 04/06/2017 on the 5600 block of Sunfish Court., the Sheriff Department responded to a report of an auto burglary. Some time between Wednesday at 1635 through Thursday 0355 the home owners vehicle was rummaged through and tools were taken from it. Their were no signs of force entry to the vehicle. Approximate value of missing tools is \$1,300.00. One of the victims neighbors had a camera system installed on their home and was able to record what appeared to be a white in color 2 door hatchback vehicle with a burnt out taillight park in front of the home. What looked like a white male exited the hatchback and entered the victims vehicle and took several items out. This occurred at approximately 0340. Due to the distance and clarity of the video, we could not make out the license plate or a better description of the suspect.

Burglary-Boat #17-4184

On 04/02/2017 on the 10 block area of Park and Ride Court in Discovery Bay the Sheriff's department took a boat burglary report. The property owner reported that stereo and speakers and other personal items were taken from his boat. In the Month of April the Sheriff's Office took 7 reports similar to this one. These 7 reported incidents involved boats and trailers being broken into and property being taken. These crimes took place between the time frame of 02/22/2017 and 03/24/2017.

Residential Burglary #17-4580

Between the dates of 03/25/2017 and 04/11/2017 on the 90 block of Shell Pl. a Residential Burglary took place. Entry into the home was made forcibly through a side garage door and once inside the garage the suspect (s) forced their way into the home through the garage door inside the garage. The home was ransacked and several items were taken. Estimated value of damage is approximately \$1,100 and value of stolen property was approximately \$5,300.00.

Residential Burglary #17-5250

Between Monday 04/24/2017 1830 and Tuesday 04/25/2017 0745 a Residential Burglary occurred on the 3500 block of Catalina way in Discovery Bay. Entry in the residence was made through an unlocked side garage door of the residence and items were taken form the home. Approximate value of stolen items is \$52,000.00.

Petty Theft –#17-4500

On 04/08/2017 a Petty Theft on the 2400 block of Pinehurst Court was reported. Home owner reported that a shoe box size safe was taken from the residence. Home owner believes it may have been from an invited guest.

Petty Theft –#17-4649

On 04/12/2017 a Petty Theft on the 4000 block of Beacon Place was reported. Home owner reported that their mailbox was taken from the property. The mail box was a black decorative type mailbox.

Petty Theft from a building – #17-4693

On 04/13/2017 a Petty Theft from a Building was reported. Home owner reported that medication was missing from his residence and was possibly taken by contract worker (s) that were hired to do work for the property owner

Petty Theft / Shoplifting #17-4780

On 04/15/2017 Safeway reported an individual entered the store and stole approximately 9 bottles of different types of whiskey with a value of \$593.91. He walked out of the store and got into a vehicle with an unidentified individual driving it. Vehicle description was obtained and video footage of the suspect from Safeway cameras was collected. This report is currently being investigated.

Suspicious Circumstances

Suspicious Circumstance— #17-5151

This report concerns the suspicious circumstances on the 4500 block of Discovery Point. Sheriff's Office received an alarm call for a residence on Discovery Point. Officers responded and checked the home. The home owner was not home and officers did a perimeter check of the home and discovered the side garage door was open. Officers entered the garage area to conduct a check and found a cabinet door open to one of the garage cabinets and items that appeared to have been taken out of the cabinet and placed on the garage floor in front of the cabinet. The homes door to the interior of the residence was locked and secured with no signs of damage to it. Officers were able to exit the garage and lock the door behind it. On duty officers continually preformed home check on the residence throughout the day.


